

# Boys' Schools are best for boys The performance of our boys in NCEA vs boys nationally in 2021

## JUNIOR CERTIFICATE

The Rotorua Boys' High School Junior Certificate plays a big part in the success our boys have at NCEA. The Junior Certificate works on a similar model to NCEA with students earning credits throughout the year in their classes and aiming to achieve 80 credits to gain their Junior Certificate. If they manage to get 50 credits at Merit or better they receive a Merit Certificate and 50 credits at Excellence gains them an Excellence Certificate. All Junior Certificates with Excellence are presented on stage at prizegiving.

## YEAR 9 CURRICULUM

As new technologies continue to change the world in which we live, they also provide many new and positive educational benefits for classroom learning. Our students use digital devices as an important tool for their learning and communicating outside of school. We are committed to learning with digital devices and are working toward our vision: Our students, through the use of digital technologies, will be offered future-focused learning opportunities, to ensure they are equipped with the skills to be successful global citizens.

Year 9 Students study English, Mathematics, Science, Te Reo Māori, Social Studies and Physical Education/Health. In addition, Year 9 students study 12 short course option subjects.


# **CAMP INFORMATION**

### Year 10 Camp at Whirinaki - Usually about week 5-6 of Term 4. \$100 approx.

### Year 9 Camp Tāne Raukura at Okataina - Week 7-8 of Term 1 - \$100 approx.

Camp Tāne Raukura is a two day outdoor education experience set up for all Year 9 students to develop self confidence and self esteem through expressing leadership in a series of group activities in an applied setting. The students perform a variety of activities in their respective houses replicating the school's traditional inter-house competition. Values are expressed in the way we think and act and therefore "Tāne Raukura" represents those values that Rotorua Boys' High School deem important to becoming a good man.

Activities at Camp Tāne Raukura include: rafting, river crossing, tramping, shooting, bush craft, orienteering, and learning the Raukura haka.



# **PASTORAL SUPPORT**

The pastoral support system at Rotorua Boys' High School is very strong with each student having a Year Level Dean and a House Group teacher. The deans are responsible for monitoring students attendance and Academic achievements. The house group teacher stays with their house group for the full 5 years to support students and to act as the first point of contact in regards to their son's attendance and progress.

### Other support available to students at Raukura include:

- 2 Guidance counsellers
- 2 Youth workers
- 1 Social worker
- 1 Full time nurse a doctor also visits once a week as does an Osteotherapist.

Many outside agencies and support people can also be called upon to offer specialised support.

# **TE HONOA TOI - HOMEWORK CENTRE**

This is a learning space available to all year levels from Monday to Thursday each week between 3-4pm in our school library. Each day a year level Dean will be present with a range of teachers from different faculties around the school. During this time boys will be provided with a quiet place to complete assessments and homework or to get extra support if necessary.

They are also provided with afternoon tea.



# **FUTURE PATHWAYS**

In addition to the work they do with their house group teacher, every boy has an interview with our Careers Advisor. The results of this interview are shared with the house group teacher and reported to parents as part of the Academic Review Day.

# ACADEMIC REVIEW DAY

Academic Review is a process of target setting and reviewing that has been designed to help our boys to focus on their goals and meet them. It has three main aims: academic achievement, co-curricular involvement and the identification of future pathways.

Twice a year we invite parents to join their sons for a 15 minute interview with his house group teacher to involve whānau in the learning process. They discuss academic and progress pathways, including both university and careers, and subject choices for the following year.

# **DIGITAL LEARNING AT ROTORUA BOYS' HIGH SCHOOL**

Digital technologies are everywhere and they are bringing many exciting opportunities for schools, impacting what, where and how education is delivered. Connected classrooms offer today's students and teachers easier and faster access to information, teaching and learning resources, peers, experts and the wider community anywhere, any time. Through the use of digital technologies, students are able to connect and collaborate with other students in a way previously inconceivable. At Rotorua Boys' High School, we have a clear vision for use of digital technologies: Our students, through the use of digital technologies, will be offered future-focused learning opportunities, to ensure they are equipped with the skills to be successful global citizens.

Rotorua Boys' High School leverage device based learning to deliver our curriculum in a manner that will improve student engagement and encourage self-directed learning. Parents, families and whānau are able to form stronger connections with our school and their son's learning. Rotorua Boys' High School is committed to allowing responsible, learner-centred use of digital devices at our school.

The school through the use of iPads and the Apple Ecosystem has set as a strategic goal becoming one of the first high schools in New Zealand to carry the Apple Distinguished School classification.

# Rotorua Boys' High School has an extensive co-curricular programme.



### In sport our boys have achieved:


- Our 1st XV Rugby Team regularly achieves at the highest level and has in 1998, 2002, 2003 and 2015 won the National Secondary Schools Rugby Championship. Our Team also won The Sanix World Tournament in 2003 and 2004.
- Our Senior Touch Team has also won a number of National Secondary School Touch Championships in 2007, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2018 and 2020.
- In Sevens both our U15 and Senior Sevens teams have won North Island and National Condor Sevens Championships.
- Our Waka Ama crews each year contest the New Zealand Secondary Schools Waka Ama Championships held at the Blue Lake with many podium finishes and National Titles.
- Our Basketball Team has placed in the Top 10 at the National Secondary Schools Championships in previous years with the best to date being fourth place in 2015.
- Our Golf Team over many years has also been one of the countries strongest with five National Titles in 1999, 2000, 2001, 2004 and 2005 and two world titles in 2001 and 2002.

# Culturally our boys have achieved:

- Raukura our Kapa Haka group has won the last two National Championships in 2016 and 2018. The group currently is the New Zealand Super Eight Schools Champions and the Regional/Te Arawa Secondary Schools Champions.
- Our Tama Pasifika Group in 2019 won the New Zealand Super Eight Schools Pasifika Competition for the first time.
- The school participates across a variety of other disciplines in the New Zealand Super Eight Schools Cultural Festival with a number of winning performances.
- In Oratory in both English and Māori the school performs impressively in Ngā Manu Korero local competitions and in National Finals.
- Every second year the school produces a musical production with our last production being a highly successful and record breaking season of Saturday Night Fever in 2020.
- Each year the school enters the Regional Big Sing competition and this year through a highly commended performance gained entry to the National Competition which will be held in Rotorua


# YEAR 9 CLASS STRUCTURE

Year 9 students are provided a thriving and diverse curriculum where they are supported, extended, and engaged through a variety of learning opportunities.

Students will strengthen their skills and understanding in the core subjects of Mathematics, English, Social Studies and Te Reo Māori and in Science they will choose modules which cover the entire science curriculum, from meaningful contexts which are of interest to them.

Year 9 students will complete all 12 options in their first year, so they are able to experience a range of subjects in order to make informed decisions to guide their future pathways in year 10. Boys will opt into either P.E or an Academy, these classes are an opportunity for boys to choose a pathway based on their interests and skills, where they will focus on their physical hauora.

Students are supported and extended in all areas of the curriculum to achieve their potential.





# TE WHARE O RAUKURA

The Whare o Raukura is the hub of Māoridom here at Raukura. Our vision is to have students engage in Te Reo Māori, kaupapa & tikanga Māori, become leaders in different arenas, leaders on paepae or ringawera of the marae, leaders in their workplace and at home. These young men are equipped with the skills, and confidence to be able to move easily in Te Ao Māori and in the wider environment.

The expectation of all students in our 9THG1 & 9THG2, 10THG1 & 10THG2, and 11THG House Groups is that they pursue Te Reo Māori as part of their subject choices, and that the kawatau o Te Whare o Raukura which are front and centre of how we operate, are upheld.We will have two Year 9 House Groups, namely 9THG1 & 9THG2. Students who indicate that they want to be part of these House Groups will need to complete the appropriate form in the enrolment pack, physical or online.

9THG1 & 9 Maire1 will consist of those who are fluent in Te Reo Māori as these students are accelerated in Year 10, and sit NCEA Level One Te Reo Māori.

9THG2 & 9 Maire2 will consist of those who have a passion for & possess basic skills in Te Reo Māori but will not be accelerated in Te Reo Māori in Year 10.

Students will undertake core subjects like Te Reo Māori, Tikanga-ā-iwi, Science, Mathematics, Physical Education or Academy Sports, and Options.

Contrary to what many people think, you do not have to be in Te Whare o Raukura House Groups in order to gain a place in our nationally & internationally recognised Raukura Kapa Haka. Students in our House Groups, Reo Māori and Te Ao Haka classes are, however, more exposed to kaupapa & tikanga Māori such as Pōhiri, Whakatau, Manu Kōrero etc.

Should students be successful in gaining a place in 9 Maire1 or 9 Maire2 next year, students and parents will be sent or given a 9 Maire1/9 Maire 2 Graduate Profile which is a list of expectations that students are to adhere to as a student of Te Whare o Raukura. Whānau hui will be held with applicants at the end of the January holidays.

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# JUBILEE SCHOLARSHIP

Since 2010 Jubilee Scholarships have been awarded each year for students enrolling at Rotorua Boys' High School. Two categories of Jubilee Scholarships are awarded:

1. Jubilee Scholarships for Academic Excellence

# 2. Jubilee Scholarships for General Excellence

These scholarships carry a financial award of \$500.00 and they are awarded to recognise excellence in either of the above categories. For all Jubilee Scholarship holders excellence in attitude, appearance and contribution is expected without exception.

To retain a Jubilee Scholarship into a subsequent year the following criteria for retaining these scholarships applies:

# 1. Academic Excellence

This scholarship will be retained if the year level certificate of that student is gained with Excellence.

If however the recipient gains their year level certificate with Merit the scholarship will be halved i.e. become \$250.00

If a student does not gain Merit or Excellence in their year level certificate they lose their Academic Excellence Scholarship.

# 2. General Excellence

This scholarship will be retained if the year level certificate of that student is gained with Merit.

If however the recipient gains their year level certificate with Achieved the scholarship will be halved i.e. become \$250.00

If a student does not gain his year level certificate they lose their General Excellence Scholarship.

The Jubilee Scholars at Rotorua Boys' High School are considered role models and therefore are expected to model at all times diligence, excellent time management and excellent appearance.



# FOR ROTORUA BOYS' HIGH SCHOOL 2015

The purpose of ERO's reviews is to give parents and the wider school community assurance about the quality of education that schools provide and their children receive. An ERO school report answers the question "How effectively is this school's curriculum promoting student learning - engagement, progress and achievement?" Under that overarching question ERO reports on the quality of education and learning outcomes for children and for specific groups of children including Māori students, Pacific students and students with special needs. ERO also reports on the quality of the school's systems for sustaining and continuing improvements. The report answers four key questions about the school.

### 1. CONTEXT

What are the important features of this school that have an impact on student learning?

A strong culture rich in Te Arawa and Ngāti Whakaue is focussed on celebrating the success of all young men. There is a 100 year history of students aspiring to national and international success. Raukura Rotorua (The Plume of Rotorua) is closely associated with leadership, taking pride in one's actions, and earning status through one's personal conduct and achievements. These high expectations for achievement and behaviour promote a positive and settled learning environment. Students experience respectful relationships based on shared values and have access to high quality counselling and healthcare. They demonstrate a strong sense of identity, belonging and pride in their school, whānau, friends and community.

...All leaders and teachers across the school are focused on developing a learning community that is responsive to the interests and aspirations of boys.

Trustees are highly committed and provide effective governance for the school...

The school provides a secondary education for young men who come from the other parts of Aotearoa, the Pacific and wider international community. A positive safe learning environment contributes to student wellbeing and success...

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## 1. I've handed in my enrolment form. What do I do next?

If enrolling for the following year, once you have handed in your forms you are enrolled. You should receive an email to acknowledge we have received your forms. If you are enrolling during the school year you will need to contact the relevant to make an enrolment meeting and bring your forms to this meeting. They will then forward the information on to the enrolment committee who will get in contact with you regarding this enrolment.

# 2. What to expect on our open days and orientation days?

The open days are a great opportunity for the boys to see what Rotorua Boys' High School is all about and what we have to offer. The boys more around the Faculties in groups and get to experience what it is like to be a student at Raukura. They also have an opportunity in the afternoon to learn about our different Sports Academies and our Physical Education Programme.

The Orientation day is for the boys who are enrolled for the following year. This is a day to make connections with our school and each other. They are put into mixed teams and compete in an Amazing Race around the school. They also learn our school Karakia and Waiata and hopefully make some new friends.

### 3. Does my son need an iPad?

Yes, an iPad for learning at Rotorua Boys' High School enables all students to have unlimited access to learning both at home and in class. As an Apple Distinguished School we pride ourselves on our ability to deliver a blended learning approach which utilises technology. Recent events have shown that learning delivered through the iPads and Google Classroom is effective and meaningful. If your son does not have an iPad, there are some available in every classroom to enable students every opportunity to digitally engage while at school.

Our schools Internet access however is limited only to Apple Ipads so your son will need to be on the schools MDM system to ensure connectivity.

## What is MDM?

MDM is the device management system that is used on the iPads to load all school related apps, to facilitate learning and to automatically manage, track and ensure our young men are being safe and responsible digital citizens. If you lease an Ipad through the school the cost of the MDM is included, if you bring your own Ipad it is a \$25 charge. Any further information regarding this MDM can be directed towards our Deputy Principal - Teaching and Learning.

## 4. What are the major day-to-day differences between intermediate and high school?

The timetable. Boys will start each day in their house group for 15 minutes, then they will move to five different classes during the day with five different teachers. We make sure at the beginning of the year that they know where their classes are, they are supported with finding their classes and their teachers so they dont have to worry about that we will help them find their way.

# During the Term 4 holidays all enrolled 2022 Year 9 students and parents/caregivers will be sent out a newsletter with all the important information that you will need to know in regards to your boy starting in 2022.
